AUEB at a glance


The Athens University of Economics and Business (AUEB) is the oldest and most prestigious University in Greece in the areas of Economics and Business Administration. It has always been on the forefront of education and research, and has produced by far the largest number of Greek industry leaders, entrepreneurs and managers, as well as faculty members and researchers in its areas of interest; it has thus played a key role in the development of the country. Situated at the crossroads of three continents, AUEB also offers an exceptional exposure to the world, bringing together issues and challenges from the European Union, the fast developing Balkan countries, and the growing giants of Asia. AUEB is an institution open to the global market and society and collaborates with more than 250 foreign Universities and institutions within the context of its educational programs, its research and other offered services. At the same time, AUEB actively participates in international organizations, fora and networks that aim to improve Higher Education, as well as in initiatives that aim to strengthen international collaborations.

Going International

Following on a hundred-year brilliant tradition of contributing to education, science and society, AUEB today enjoys broad international recognition. The international prestige and reputation of the university reflects the high level of teaching and research staff; the modern curricula on offer; the high employability of its graduates in the labor market; and its distinct social impact. Internationally oriented as it is, AUEB currently offers Masters programs of international outreach, enrolling students not just from the European Union but also from the Balkans, the Middle East, the United States, Latin America, Africa and China. The first Master program to be taught in English at AUEB was the MBA International program, which is accredited by the international Association of MBAs. Today eight (8) Masters programs of AUEB are taught in English, and welcome hundreds of international students every year.

AUEB has been also ranked among places 151-151-200 in the field of Accounting and Finance consequently from 2018 till 2023. QS Masters in Finance Rankings also rank AUEB in place 98 world widely.

The Department of Accounting and Finance of AUEB was established in 1999, and from then on has gained great popularity amongst prospective undergraduate students. The Department has consistently ranked high in the recent past years in terms of students' preferences, both among all academic departments of AUEB, as well as among similar Departments of all higher education institutions in Greece. The Department's curriculum is up to date and equivalent to the curricula of similar undergraduate programs in top universities all over the world. At the same time the Department's curriculum is adapted to the Greek reality, thus designed to accommodate the professional needs for accounting and finance skills in the Greek market place. The faculty members of the Department are scientists with notable presence in the European and international scientific community, with numerable participations in international conferences, and published research in the most respectable scientific and professional journals. Currently, the Department has about twenty one (21) active PhD candidates who are preparing their doctoral theses in selected areas of Accounting and Finance, under the supervision of the Department's academic staff, while sixty six (66) PhD candidates have successfully completed their PhD dissertation, and are currently employed as faculty members or in major financial institutions and enterprises in Greece or abroad.

The Masters Program (M.Sc.) in Financial Management

The Masters program in Financial Management was established in September 2018 (M.D. 5584_ 3841/B'/6-9-2018) and is entirely taught in English, mainly aiming to attract international students or Greek students who are interested in attending a Masters program in English. The program flaunts this way an international profile, in line with the latest global economic and business developments, thus reinforcing AUEB and its graduates' skills for competing in the international market place. The program's curriculum is up to date and in line with the latest scientific developments, designed to offer high quality specialized scientific knowledge in the field of Financial Management, focusing on current international trends in the area.

The Program's Mission

The program's mission is the advancement of knowledge and scientific research in the field of Financial Management. Especially when considering the unstable national and international economic conditions, as well as the high complexity of financial markets, specified knowledge in this field is now more than ever essential for climbing the executive ladder in any given industry. This mission is accomplished through a contemporary and well designed curriculum that utilizes a variety of teaching methods apart from the study of international scientific literature, such as laboratory classes, case studies, and individual or team assignments.

Admission Criteria and Application Process

The evaluation and acceptance of applicants is based on the following criteria:

- Bachelor Degree (GPA) from a recognized university.
- Two recommendation letters.
- Very good command of the English language, as indicated by a TOEFL, TOEIC, IELTS score or CAE/CPE.
- Work experience (only for part time applicants).
- Personal interview by the Admissions Committee.

How to apply

The program has a rolling admissions procedure, which commences in January, with multiple deadlines every year. Places available are limited, so prospective students are advised to submit their applications early. Applications are submitted online at https://e-graduate.applications.aueb.gr.

Required Documents:

- Copies of all University Degrees/Diplomas.
- Official Transcripts of marks received.
- CV in English.
- English language certification verifying very good command of the language (> C1 CEFR level).
- Two confidential recommendation letters.
- Proof of employment record, if any (required only for part time applicants).

Program's Structure and Curriculum

The Master's Program in Financial Management is equal to seventy five (75) ECTS credits (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System), and includes twelve (12) courses, worth five (5) ECTS credits each, as well as the MSc thesis, worth fifteen (15) ECTS credits. Students might alternatively undertake an internship instead of the MSc thesis.

Courses offered:

- a full time 12-month course
- a part time 24-month course

Financial Management

The specialization is addressed to students who are interested in attending a top quality master's program in Financial Management. The curriculum is designed to develop them into business executives that use their knowledge of advanced corporate finance and financial reporting tools in evaluating and resolving complex business situations. Students will:

- develop an advanced understanding of the use and implementation of applied financial management tools required for a successful and efficient management of a multinational company.
- be qualified to work as top executives in the financial management business field.

Data Driven Financial Management

The program aims to attract students interested in attending a quality master's program with core orientation in Financial Management, who are also interested in acquiring technical skills in data analytics that will help them resolve corporate problems that require the analysis of large amounts of financial data. The program is also addressed to business executives who wish to develop their business decision-making skills by using insights derived from available data and evolve their skills in the challenging scientific field of Financial Management.

Why Study at AUEB's MSc in Financial Management

Attracting top quality applicants from all over the world

The Masters program in Financial Management offers an intense study program and aims to attract highly motivated intelligent applicants, with good undergraduate studies, very good command of the English language, talent, and good prospects, who are ready to work hard and have the ambition to reach top positions on the executive ladder. The Program is addressed to students that have recently graduated and seek to continue their studies at postgraduate level (full time course), as well as to business executives holding a bachelor degree who wish to upgrade their knowledge in the field of Financial Management (part time course).

Attractive value for money tuition fees

The program's tuition fees come up to 6.200€ for the full time course and 6.400€ for the part time course. The tuition fees are paid in several installments. Upon decision of the Departmental staff meeting, and taking into consideration the then current social and economic conditions, the program may grant individual scholarships. Moreover, students may be exempt from the tuition fees according to law no.4957/2022.

Modern facilities and infrastructure

All AUEB's postgraduate lectures take place in Postgraduate Studies Building, which is located at the corner of 47 Evelpidon and 33 Lefkados Streets. Lectures also take place at the new fully renovated building of AUEB situated at 2 Troias Str.

Workshops

The program offers for free several optional workshops per year on softwares that are considered essential in the financial manager's profession, so as to better qualify its graduates for the highly competitive labor market. Workshops that are being currently offered include:

- Microsoft Excel for Finance Professionals
- Python for Financial Applications
- Power BI and Data Visualization
- Soft Skills

Research Laboratories

The Laboratory of Accounting Applications

The Laboratory of Accounting Applications develops academic thinking and research in the areas of Accounting and Accounting Information Systems. Modern software is available, such as Modern Accounting 2000, EVal, EViews, WinRats, Limdep, Gauss, and Stata, and access provided to several databases such as DataStream Advance, Compus-tat, ICAP Data, Perfect Analysis, International Accounting Standards, and the Stock Exchange Database from the Athens Stock Exchange. Furthermore, the Accounting Laboratory has developed a series of integrated information systems which support accounting processes for a number of private and public institutions.

The Laboratory for Applied Finance

The aim of the Laboratory is to develop advanced – theoretical and applied – research in finance and to employ this research not only in teaching but also in the process of problem solving for companies and organizations in the modern economic environment. The Laboratory offers twenty four (24) work stations and is equipped with specialized computer software and databases, such as: Eviews, SPSS, WinRATS, Matlab, OxMetrics, Limdep, Stata SE, Pertrac Analytical Platform, Perfect Analysis and Eikon for Students, Audit Analytics, Thomson1, Bloomberg, Clarkson, Compustat, DealScan. Several educational seminars on the usage of databases and software are organized in the laboratory's premises.

The Laboratory for Business Analysis and Valuation

The Laboratory serves teaching and research needs of the Department in the scientific fields of "Business Analysis and Valuation", "Fraud Examination", "Auditing", and "Tax Accounting".

The Laboratory of Behavioral Finance

The Behavioral Finance Laboratory (BeFin Lab) has been founded in order to support the research and teaching needs of the Department of Accounting & Finance at AUEB, with a focus on issues related to Behavioral Finance. More specifically, the research focus of the Lab will be on issues such as Prospect Theory & Rationality, Investor Psychology, Heuristics, Investor Sentiment, Herd Behavior, Investor Overreaction, Investor Underreaction, Contrarian and Momentum Strategies, Monetary Policy and Economic Expectations. Furthermore, the Lab aims to encourage scientific collaboration with international research centers and academic institutions, to organize scientific lectures, seminars, symposia, and conferences, like the 2018 National FEBS Conference, as well as to invite quest speakers for open lectures, and encourage its members to publish high quality research papers that contribute to the scientific literature in the field of behavioral finance. The Lab is also able to provide services related to research projects.

The Laboratory for International Shipping, Finance and Management (interdepartmental)

The Laboratory for International Shipping, Finance and Management of the Athens University of Economics and Business (ISFM Lab) is dedicated to performing theoretical and applied research in the key areas of shipping, finance and management. The mission of the ISFM LAB is to:

- Conduct forefront research on topics related to shipping markets.
- Enhance collaboration with other Research Centers and Academic Institutions worldwide.
- Collaborate with various public and private organizations.
- Develop educational, research-based and other similar activities.
- Organize and host conferences, like the 27th Annual Conference of the International Association of Maritime Economists (IAME) 2019.
- Undertake projects and consultancy work related to shipping, finance or management.

Effective networking with the industry

The University enjoys excellent relations with industry, offering customized programs to an increasing number of Greek or international companies, cooperating with leading organizations in research, and receiving grants for research, consulting and executive training. These relations offer a strong competitive advantage to our students while they study, but also after they graduate, and help them meet the demands of the local and international labor market. The program's students and graduates are assisted and guided by AUEB's Career Office in decisions related to their future employment and career path. Within the framework of services provided, the Career Office has developed and is constantly expanding a broad network of dynamic partnerships with large organizations and corporations in Greece and abroad, is posting job announcements, organizes events and workshops, and offers consultancy in career related areas. The Office has been hosting, ever since 1993, the "Career Days" event, during which all AUEB's undergraduate and postgraduate students and alumni have the chance to meet in person and interact with potential employers from a variety of different business sectors.
